

Tenafly Nature Center Celebrates 50th Anniversary with Gala Dinner & Founders Award Presentation

(Tenafly, NJ February 14, 2011) – Love to return to nature? The Tenafly Nature Center (TNC) has been making that possible since1961 for Tenafly residents, surrounding area communities and educational/service groups for 50 years. The Board of Trustees is hosting a Gala Celebration marking Tenafly Nature Center's 50 years of Environmental Leadership at the Clinton Inn in Tenafly, on March 6, 2011.

Thanks to the group of far-sighted TNC founders, who worked to protect "an Island of Green" in Tenafly, two generations ago, we have developed an exceptional 400-acre outdoor classroom, actively enjoyed by 23,000 visitors each year," noted Mike Neus. "Our challenge is to keep the founders' vision alive for future generations, providing environmental education and nurturing an appreciation of the outdoors."

The Gala Dinner will include live and silent auctions. Tickets are \$100 per person with all proceeds raised to support TNC's mission of open space preservation and nature, science and environmental education. Aidan Quinn, actor and director, and a local resident, is serving as the event's Honorary Chairman. Classical guitarist Hanan Harchol will provide music for the event.

The Gala Dinner will also include the Founders Award Presentation. TNC will honor past TNC presidents and Alpine's Mayor, Paul Tomasko, will receive TNC's 2011 Founders Award for Conservation. The Founders Award presentation honors individuals who have made sustained contributions to the Tenafly Nature Center or whose significant efforts have helped to preserve the natural environment in Tenafly and the surrounding communities. Past recipients include Tenafly's Mayor Peter Rustin, former Tenafly Environmental Commission Chair, Byron "Gus" Allen, long-time TNC Environmental Educator, Judith Massey, former Tenafly Councilwoman Patricia Symonds, 1970s TNC President, Nadine Freiman, and 1960s TNC President, Don Zeiller and his wife, Joyce.

Paul H. Tomasko has served the Nature Center's neighboring town of Alpine 18 years as an elected official and as a member of Alpine's Environmental Commission and Planning Board. He has been a consistent advocate of open space preservation and of environmental protection and sustainability. "Future generations will remember us partly for how we measure up to the environmental challenges of today," he noted.

The Montessori House School, located in Tenafly, is the event's Gold Sponsor. According to Maria Morningstar, Director of The Montessori House school, "With students from age 2-1/2 through 1st grade, our children enjoy Tenafly Nature Center programs each year.
